IN the parable of the Good Samaritan it is said that a priest and a Levite passed by the wounded man and help was given him by one of another race-namely, the Samaritan. We do not know whatever happened to the priest and the Levite, but it is very likely that they went into Jerusalem and reported the condition of the dying man to a social service agency. The point of the parable is that some neighbors have to be helped in their emergency at the cost of our convenience. The neighbor is not the one who lives next door, nor the one with whom we have a nodding acquaintance. What makes a man a neighbor is love in the heart. When this is wanting it avails nothing that a man lives in the same block, or belongs to the same club, for none of these external bonds can supply the place of love.

The story of the Good Samaritan was told in answer to the question of a lawyer: "Who is my neighbor?" The answer of the parable is: "Every man in distress is your neighbor." Sometimes that neighbor is the one who is least capable of making known his condition. Not long ago one of the nationally known picture magazines had a photograph of a man prostrate on subway stairs. For thirty minutes many people passed him by without ever a helping hand. The editorial comment was about the coldness of the modern man in the face of distress. What was forgotten was that the photographer of the picture magazine did nothing for thirty minutes for the afflicted individual except to snap pictures and make his own living. The unfortunate traveler on the road between Jericho and Jerusalem could make no importunate supplications for relief, could not even ask for help. The need is often greatest where the least is asked...

Love that desires to limit its own exercise is not love. Love that is happier if it meets only one who needs help than if it met ten, and happiest if it met none at all, is not love. One of love's essential laws is expressed in the words of Our Lord that the Apostles fondly remembered after He ascended: "It is more blessed to give than to receive." Our nation will be happier...when we discover the true brotherhood of man, but to do this we must realize that we are a race of illegitimate children unless there is also the Fatherhood of God. - *from Way to Inner Peace by Venerable Fulton J.
