


LENTEN RICE BOWLS Again, this Lent Fr. Gonzalez is asking the parish to participate in rice bowls as a way to collect money for the poor of our city who are served by the Sisters of Mother Teresa, the Missionaries of Charity. Rice bowls can be picked in the vestibule beginning next Sunday. They are due back to the Church no later than Monday, April 13th. They can be dropped off at the Church office or in the vestibule.

For those not familiar with these Sisters, they are part of Mother Teresa's order, the Missionaries of Charity, founded in 1948. Mother Teresa actually came to Memphis in 1988 to open the doors of the Sisters of Charity house, which still operates today. The house at 700 N. 7th Street in downtown Memphis provides food and shelter for homeless women and children. The Sisters pray with the women and children, take them to daily Mass and daily Holy Hour, and show God's love and mercy to the poorest of the poor in Memphis. They also work with Catholic Charities of West Tennessee to find permanent housing for these women. Currently there are four Sisters serving the poor at the house, which can shelter up to eighteen people. This Lent, please consider helping Little Flower Parish fill rice bowls for the poorest of the poor in Memphis. May God richly bless you for your participation!
